Using WSIC dashboards and RADAR to deliver consistent and effective Population Health Management

Following the successful delivery of the first workshop in September (link to recording), this 90 minute session will provide a brief overview of population health management and how the WSIC dashboards can support effective delivery. The October workshop will take a deeper dive into WSIC RADAR demonstrating how it can be used to identify and manage risk and to support effective decision-making with a particular focus on neighbourhood health.

Foundation Co-production training

This two part foundation level training is aimed at ICS staff who would benefit from developing their understanding of co-production and can see how these approaches can enhance their role and support meaningful, co-produced service change. The training focuses on practical tools and methods for applying co-production principles across a wide range of collaboratively planned activities and interventions in NW London. It uses case studies and real life examples to explore how we can improve our approach to working with our communities through inclusive and partnership-based working.

Cultural Competency training

Designed for ICS staff who work directly with residents and members of the public, and who recognise the value of developing cultural competence to enhance their practice, strengthen relationships, influence behaviours, and support meaningful service change. This training focuses on practical approaches to understanding, applying, and embedding cultural competence across a wide range of collaboratively planned activities and interventions in NW London. It will also explore how to challenge traditional models of service planning and delivery by fostering more inclusive and responsive ways of working.

Practical approaches to research - what you need to get started

This 90 minute workshop will provide an introduction to secondary research and why it's important for service planning. It will help you identify where to go to find relevant evidence and explore how to apply evidence to real-world questions about service improvement and investment.

Evaluation training

This training is for Commissioners and Providers in NW London ICB who are new to evaluation. It introduces the basic principles of evaluation and how to understand impact to inform decision making and covers: getting value from an evaluation; how to unpack cause and effect: introduction to mixed methods; how to use measurement to inform your evaluation: introduction to measurement techniques & data collection; and is it worth it - introduction to economic & financial evaluation.

Foundation training in Health Economics & Value-based Care

This training offers a practical introduction to the role of economics in health and social care. Participants will learn how to assess economic value, support health equity, apply tools for economic evaluation, and use evidence to demonstrate the impact of service improvements and inform decision-making at local and national levels.

Business Case Masterclass
